GODPARENTS CEREMONY

Officiant:

It acknowledges and values the importance of nurturing and taking responsibility for children in our wider community.

By making a commitment at a ceremony, you show your love and support to the whole family.

Are you willing to follow and help guide [CHILD] through the various stages of his life, with understanding and a readiness and a willingness to listen?

To be a friend and confidante when necessary?

To give that loyalty and support to [PARENTS] when they need it?

Are you willing to accept the role of godparents in the name of love and friendship for [PARENTS]?

Godparents: We are.

Officiant:

I want the godparents to now touch this little one's hands, so that he may now know from your loving touch that he will receive all those personal gifts from you which you have undertaken to give today.

Now I would like to ask the godparents to come forward and light the candles.

The lighting of the candle is the ceremonial acknowledgment that you accept the responsibilities laid upon you.

The flame represents the light which will guide and protect [CHILD] through life's journey of tears and laughter, of joy and sadness, of happiness and sorrow and great love.

(Godparents light individual taper candles, followed by the lighting of the center candle)

[CHILD] we welcome you as a member of the community of life on Earth.

May all be well with you in your journey through life.

May the bright light of God's angels guard you.

May the bright light of God's love be with you.

May the bright light of the Spirits presence surround and enfold you all the days and nights of your life.

FINAL WORDS/INTRODUCTION OF [CHILD]
